PART 1—PRELIMINARY

101. *Objective*

The objective of these Regulations is to provide for matters relating to the operation of the public transport system of the Public Transport Corporation including ticketing, travel conditions, behaviour of the public and passengers and conditions of carriage of passengers and freight.

102. *Authorising provisions*

These Regulations are made under section 56 of the **Transport Act 1983**.

103. *Revocations*

The following Regulations are revoked—

- (a) the *Transport (Public Rail and Road Vehicle) Regulations 1984; and

- (b) the ****Transport (State Transport Authority) Regulations 1984**; and
- (c) the *****Transport (Metropolitan Transit Authority) Regulations 1984**.

104. Definitions

In these Regulations—

“Act” means the **Transport Act 1983**;

“authorised person” means—

- (a) a person employed or authorised by the Corporation who has duties in relation to the issue, inspection or collection of tickets or the operation of a rail or road vehicle;
- (b) a person employed by the Corporation who has duties in relation to the inspection and supervision of rail or road vehicles;
- (c) a member of the police force of Victoria;
- (d) any other person appointed or authorised by the Corporation for any of the purposes of Part VII of the Act;

“Corporation” means the Public Transport Corporation;

“Corporation’s premises” means any land, building, premises or structure owned, occupied or leased by the Corporation;

“designated area” means an area within the Corporation’s premises designated by the Corporation by means of signs in or near the area as an area for being on which a ticket is required;

“empties” means any box, package, case or container of any kind which is being returned empty after the carriage of freight;

“goods” means any article, package, parcel, item of luggage, merchandise chattel or animal (whether dead or alive);

“periodical ticket” means a ticket valid for more than one day;

“rail vehicle” means any carriage, wagon, truck, bicycle or quadricycle which is used or intended for use by the Corporation on any railway;

“road vehicle” means any vehicle propelled by any form of motive power which is used or intended for use by the Corporation for the carriage of passengers or freight on any road, lane, bridge, thoroughfare or place open to or used by the public for passage with vehicles and includes a tram and light rail vehicle which is used or intended for use by the Corporation on any tramway;

“ticket” means a ticket, pass, symbol or other thing issued to a person entitling that person to travel on a rail or road vehicle or be in a designated area;

“travel concession card” means a non-transferable concession card issued by a State or Commonwealth Government Department or the Corporation and accepted by the Corporation as entitling the holder to travel on rail or road vehicles at concessional fares fixed by the Corporation.

PART 2—TICKETS AND CONDITIONS OF TRAVEL

201. *Ticket conditions*

- (1) The Corporation is not liable to the holder of a ticket for any loss, damage or delay caused by or arising from an act of God or inevitable accident, riot, civil commotion, strike, lockout, stoppage or restraint of labour, regardless of the cause.

- (2) The Corporation is not liable to pay any person damages of more than \$600 in respect of any loss of, or damage to, goods accompanying a passenger on a journey.
- (3) The Corporation may use any mode of transport to carry passengers and may substitute the mode of transport used at any time, including during a journey.
- (4) The Corporation is not liable to the holder of a ticket—
 - (a) for any consequences arising from any variation in the time of arrival or departure from any station or stopping point of any rail or road vehicle; or
 - (b) for any loss or damage as a result of the cancellation or any variation in the time of arrival or departure from any station or stopping point of any rail or road vehicle.
- (5) The Corporation may cancel wholly or in part any of the scheduled services shown in the Corporation's timetables or vary the point at which rail or road services will pick up and set down passengers.
- (6) A ticket is issued subject to any alteration which the Corporation may make to the service to which the ticket relates during the currency of the ticket and the holder of the ticket is not entitled to any allowance or compensation due to any change in the time of the service or any reduction in the service.
- (7) The Corporation is not required to refund money or to make any other allowance to the holder of a ticket which is lost or mislaid.
- (8) The Corporation is not required to refund money or to make any other allowance to the holder of a periodical ticket due to any reduction of the cost of that ticket.
- (9) The holder of a periodical ticket may be required to pay the ordinary fare payable for a journey on a rail or road vehicle or for entry to a designated area, if the holder cannot produce the periodical ticket to an authorised person on request.

- (10) A ticket issued by the Corporation remains the property of the Corporation at all times.
- (11) The Corporation may waive its rights under sub-regulation (1), (2), (4), (6) or (7) and make any payment to any person that it thinks fit.

202. *Expired ticket*

A person must not use or attempt to use a ticket where the time for the using of that ticket or travel concession card has either expired or has not arrived.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

203. *Defaced ticket or concession card*

A person must not, without reasonable excuse, tender to an authorised person a ticket or travel concession card which has been materially altered, defaced, mutilated or made illegible in any way.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

204. *Ticket not to be transferred*

A person who has begun to use a ticket that has not yet expired must not transfer that ticket to another person unless authorised by an authorised person.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

205. *Surrender of ticket*

The holder of a ticket must surrender that ticket to an authorised person at the end of the period or journey for which the ticket was issued or at any time after the start of that period or journey if asked to do so by the person.

Penalty: 3 penalty units.

206. *Ticket to be validated*

A person using a ticket which requires machine validation must validate that ticket on boarding a rail

or road vehicle on which an operational ticket validating device is located or before entering a designated area.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

207. *Give up seat*

- (1) A person must vacate a seat which is designated for elderly or disabled passengers on a rail or road vehicle if asked to do so by an authorised person.
- (2) The holder of a student concession ticket must vacate a seat on a rail or road vehicle on which there are no empty seats if asked to do so by an authorised person.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

208. *Reserved seat*

A person must not, after being asked by an authorised person to refrain from doing so, occupy or attempt to occupy in any rail or road vehicle, a seat or compartment which has been reserved by the Corporation for another person.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

209. *Requirements relating to services which must be booked*

If on a service provided by the Corporation, the Corporation specifies that it is compulsory to book a seat, sleeping berth or reserved standing room and permission has not been obtained from an authorised person, a person must not—

- (a) travel or attempt to travel on that service without booking a seat, sleeping berth or standing room;
or
- (b) occupy or attempt to occupy any other seat, sleeping berth or standing room that has not been allocated to that person.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

210. *Person not to remain in first class compartment without ticket or consent*

A person must not remain or travel in a first class compartment of any rail or road vehicle unless that person—

- (a) possesses a first class ticket for travel in that compartment; or
- (b) has obtained the consent of an authorised person to travel or remain in that compartment.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

211. *Unauthorised person to leave vehicle or premises*

A person must not, unless in possession of a valid ticket authorising that person to do so, remain in or upon any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises after being asked by an authorised person to leave the vehicle or premises.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

212. *Stops only for boarding or alighting*

A person must not—

- (a) board a rail or road vehicle at a stop where the vehicle has stopped only to set down passengers; or
- (b) alight from a rail or road vehicle at a stop where the vehicle has stopped only to pick up passengers.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

213. *Person not to assist fare evasion*

A person must not knowingly assist another person to evade payment of a fare or to defraud the Corporation, or do or omit to do anything which would be a breach of regulation 202, 203, 204 or 206.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

PART 3—OFFENCES ON VEHICLES OR PREMISES

301. *Behaviour offences*

- (1) A person must not while in or on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises—
- (a) gamble, unless the vehicle or premises is licenced for gambling; or
 - (b) operate or play any musical instrument, radio, tape player or any other instrument or device capable of emitting sound, unless the sound is contained by the use of headphones; or
 - (c) throw down, drop or otherwise deposit, except in a receptacle provided for the purpose, any litter, tin, carton, package, paper, glass, food, refuse or other rubbish.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

- (2) A person must not—
- (a) ride a bicycle, pedal cycle, scooter, moped, skate board, in-line skates, roller skates or similar device on the Corporation's premises, in any rail or road vehicle or on any railway platform; or
 - (b) drive, carry, ride or lead any animal on, or allow any animal to stray onto, the Corporation's premises; or
 - (c) bring any dog on to the Corporation's premises unless the dog is properly restrained by a harness or by a lead attached to a collar or choker chain; or
 - (d) convey or attempt to convey in a rail or road vehicle, except in a compartment set aside for its carriage, any animal.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

- (3) A person must not while in or on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises—
- (a) use any indecent, insulting, obscene, offensive, or threatening language or gesture; or

- (b) commit any nuisance or act in a way that is likely to interfere with the comfort of any other person; or
- (c) convey or attempt to convey any goods, substances or things which are likely to be a source of annoyance or discomfort to any other person or are liable to cause injury to or to endanger any person or to damage the road or rail vehicle or any property; or
- (d) write, draw or affix any word representation, character or poster on or to any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

- (4) A person must not while in or upon any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises—
 - (a) behave in a disorderly, indecent, offensive or riotous manner; or
 - (b) destroy, damage, deface, mutilate or injure any property of the Corporation; or
 - (c) throw any thing at any vehicle, premises or other property whether or not that vehicle, premises or property is owned or occupied by the Corporation.

Penalty: 15 penalty units.

- (5) A person must not while in a rail or road vehicle in motion protrude any object from a door or window.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

- (6) A person must not place any thing on any railway or tramway track.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

- (7) Sub-regulations (2) (b), (c) and (d) do not apply to—
 - (a) a blind person accompanied by a guide dog; or
 - (b) a person accompanied by a guide dog in training; or
 - (c) a person whose hearing is impaired and who is accompanied by a guide dog; or

- (d) a person conveying an animal or bird which is contained in a suitable receptacle of a type approved by the Corporation unless directed otherwise by an authorised person.
- (8) This regulation does not apply to anything done or omitted to be done in the course of his or her duties by a member of the police force or a person employed by the Corporation.

302. *Not to operate equipment*

A person must not without the permission of an authorised person—

- (a) move, interfere with, tamper with, operate or attempt to operate any equipment, rail or road vehicle or any apparatus or device owned or operated by the Corporation; or
- (b) light or extinguish or operate any lamp, light or signal owned or operated by the Corporation.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

303. *Not to apply brake*

A person must not, without reasonable excuse, apply any brake or make use of any emergency device fitted to a rail or road vehicle.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

304. *Not to stop vehicle*

A person must not, without reasonable excuse, cause or attempt to cause a rail or road vehicle in motion to be stopped.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

305. *Use of doors on vehicles and premises*

A person must not without reasonable excuse—

- (a) unlock a lock or open a locked door on any rail or road vehicle; or

- (b) lock any unlocked door on any rail or road vehicle; or
- (c) open or interfere with any locked gate or door on the Corporation's premises; or
- (d) close or interfere with any gate or door on the Corporation's premises, which has been unlocked or opened by any authorised person or employee of the Corporation; or
- (e) open or hold open on any rail or road vehicle which is in motion any door which provides access to the outside of the rail or road vehicle.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

306. *Not to interfere with automatic door*

If an automatic door is fitted to any rail or road vehicle, a person must not—

- (a) prevent or attempt to prevent the door from opening or closing; or
- (b) open or attempt to open the door before the release mechanism is operated by an authorised person; or
- (c) make use of the door in a manner likely to cause damage to the release or closing mechanism connected to the door.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

307. *Not to cross pit between platforms*

A person must not without the permission of an authorised person enter any place between 2 platforms where it is necessary for that person to descend from one of the platforms and cross over the railway track to gain access to the other.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

308. Rail crossing places

- (1) A person must not cross or attempt to cross over any railway—
 - (a) at a place provided as a crossing place at which gates are located unless the gates are opened or unlocked to permit vehicular or foot traffic; or
 - (b) if a train in motion is in sight and is approaching; or
 - (c) at any place provided as a crossing place if asked by a police officer or a Corporation employee to refrain from so doing.
- (2) The driver of a motor vehicle must, when approaching a railway level crossing, stop the vehicle so that the point of the vehicle is on the approach side of, and safely clear of, the nearest rail and of any gate, boom or barrier at the crossing unless the driver can proceed through the level crossing without stopping before the rear of the vehicle is on the departure side of and safely clear of the furthest rail and of any gate, boom or barrier at the crossing.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

309. No exit, entry, or travel except in proper place

- (1) A person who does not have either a reasonable excuse or the permission of an authorised person must not—
 - (a) enter or leave a station, platform or other part of the Corporation's premises other than by means of an entrance or exit provided for passengers or the public; or
 - (b) enter or leave a road vehicle other than by means of an exit or entrance for passengers on the left hand side of the vehicle in the direction of travel; or
 - (c) enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave a rail vehicle by means other than a doorway which adjoins a platform.

Penalty: 15 penalty units.

- (2) A person must not without reasonable excuse—
- (a) travel on or attempt to travel on a locomotive or on the roof of a rail or road vehicle or a coupling or communicating platform between rail or road vehicles or on or in any part of a rail or road vehicle other than a part intended for the carriage of passengers; or
 - (b) mount or attempt to mount a locomotive or the roof of a rail or road vehicle or a coupling or communicating platform between rail or road vehicles or on or in any part of a rail or road vehicle other than a part intended for the carriage of passengers; or
 - (c) mount, climb or walk on any part of the Corporation's premises or any structure on those premises not intended for use by passengers or the public.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

310. *No dangerous goods on vehicles or premises*

- (1) A person must not take into or on to, or attempt to take into or on to, any rail or road vehicle or part of the Corporation's premises explosives, inflammable liquid or any thing which may project beyond the rail or road vehicle.
- (2) A person must not take, or attempt to take, in to or on to a rail or road vehicle or on to the Corporation's premises any thing that a Corporation employee has told the person is liable to cause injury to or to endanger any person or to damage the rail or road vehicle or any property.

Penalty: 15 penalty units.

311. *No fuel in vehicle carried*

A person must not consign for carriage by the Corporation a motor vehicle or motor cycle from which the fuel has not been drained.

Penalty: 15 penalty units.

312. *No fires on premises*

A person must not—

- (a) light a fire on the Corporation's premises or on any rail or road vehicle, unless authorised in writing by the Corporation; or
- (b) leave a fire which has been lit by that person on the Corporation's premises or on any rail or road vehicle until such fire is completely extinguished; or
- (c) bring any burning substance into or on to any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises or by any act or omission cause a burning substance to be brought into or upon any such vehicle or premises in circumstances likely to cause injury to or to endanger any person or to damage the rail or road vehicle or any property; or
- (d) throw or drop any burning substance on to or from any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises or by any act or omission cause it to happen that a burning substance including a cigarette is thrown or dropped on to or from any such vehicle or premises; or
- (e) throw any burning substance at a rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises.

Penalty: 15 penalty units.

313. *No firearms on premises*

A person, other than a member of the police force while on duty, must not carry, bring, or attempt to carry or bring any loaded or unloaded firearm or any imitation firearm on to any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises unless authorised in writing by the Corporation.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

314. *Not to discharge firearm*

A person, other than a member of the police force while on duty, must not discharge or attempt to discharge any firearm on or at any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises unless authorised in writing by the Corporation.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

315. *Not to cause obstruction*

A person must not create an obstruction in or about any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

316. *No spitting*

A person must not spit on any part of any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises or at or on any other person on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

317. *No unauthorised drinking*

A person must not drink any intoxicating liquor in or on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises unless the liquor has been purchased from, and is consumed at, a place that has been authorised by the Corporation for that purpose.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

318. *No articles on seats*

A person must not, without reasonable excuse, prevent another person from occupying a seat in a rail or road vehicle in the vicinity of the seat he or she is occupying by placing a part of his or her body or any article of any kind on that seat and refusing to move the article or part of his or her body when asked.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

319. *Not to drain onto Corporation's land*

A person must not cause or permit drainage or sewage to flow or empty from any premises occupied by the person on to the Corporation's premises.

Penalty: 10 penalty units.

320. *Not to drive or leave vehicle on premises*

A person must not drive, ride, park or leave standing any motor vehicle on any part of the Corporation's premises that is not set aside by the Corporation for the use of motor vehicles.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

321. *Compliance of driver with directions*

A person who drives or rides a motor vehicle on the Corporation's premises must—

- (a) comply with all reasonable directions of an authorised person; and
- (b) obey all relevant speed restrictions, traffic control signs and parking control signs displayed on the premises; and
- (c) not drive in a manner which is likely to cause injury to or to endanger any person or to damage any property; and
- (d) not leave the vehicle standing so as to cause an obstruction.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

322. *Overdimensional vehicle on tracks*

- (1) A person must not drive or attempt to drive or convey across any railway track—
 - (a) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance the mass limit of which exceeds the mass limit prescribed in Division 2 of Part 7 of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 1988 except under

and in accordance with a permit or notice issued under Division 4 of that Part; or

- (b) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance which, either by itself or in combination with any load carried by it, exceeds 4.9 metres in height (when measured from the uppermost surface of the track to be crossed) or 3 metres in breadth; or
- (c) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance which may obstruct, displace or interfere with the track to be crossed or with any overhead power line of the Corporation in the vicinity of the track—

without the written permission of the Corporation obtained at least 2 clear working days before then.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

- (2) A person must not drive or attempt to drive or convey across any tramway track—
 - (a) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance the mass limit of which exceeds the mass limit prescribed in Division 2 of Part 7 of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 1988 except under and in accordance with a permit or notice issued under Division 4 of that Part; or
 - (b) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance which, either by itself or in combination with any load carried by it, exceeds 4.3 metres in height (when measured from the uppermost surface of the track to be crossed) or 6 metres in breadth; or
 - (c) any motor vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance which may obstruct, displace or interfere with the track to be crossed or with any overhead power line or support wires of the Corporation in the vicinity of the track—

without the written permission of the Corporation obtained at least 2 clear working days before then.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

- (3) The person must comply with any conditions imposed by the Corporation in granting permission under sub-regulation (1) or (2).

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

- (4) The fee for the granting of permission under sub-regulation (1) or (2) is \$34.
- (5) In addition to this fee, the Corporation may impose the charges set out in the Schedule if, in the opinion of the Corporation, the presence of one or more Corporation officers or agents is necessary in the interests of safety when the vehicle, machine, trailer or contrivance crosses the railway or tramway track.

323. *Animals on tracks*

A person must not ride, lead or drive or attempt to ride, lead or drive an animal across any railway level crossing—

- (a) when a train in motion is in sight and is approaching the crossing; or
- (b) when warned by means of a warning device or sign that a train is approaching the crossing; or
- (c) when asked by a Corporation employee to refrain from so doing.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

324. *Request to leave vehicle*

- (1) An authorised person may ask a person to leave a rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises if—
- (a) when the person entered the rail or road vehicle it was fully loaded with passengers; or
- (b) the person refuses, or is unable, to pay the appropriate fare or charge; or
- (c) the person remains in a doorway, vestibule, corridor or gangway after being asked by an authorised person to refrain from doing so; or

- (d) the person's clothing or luggage may in the opinion of an authorised person soil or damage any property of the Corporation or the property of any other person; or
 - (e) the person enters, boards or attempts to enter or board or remain on board the rail or road vehicle after having been asked by an authorised person to refrain from doing so; or
 - (f) the person commits an offence against the Act or these Regulations.
- (2) A person who has been asked to leave a rail or road vehicle or premises under sub-regulation (1) must comply with the request immediately.
- Penalty: 10 penalty units.
- (3) An authorised person may remove from a vehicle or premises any person who fails to comply with a request made under sub-regulation (1).

325. *No selling or busking*

A person must not while on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation's premises unless authorised in writing by the Corporation to do so—

- (a) hawk, sell, hire, offer or expose for sale or for hire any articles or goods of any description; or
- (b) tout, solicit or ply for custom, hire or employment of any description; or
- (c) distribute hand bills; or
- (d) solicit money or goods; or
- (e) busk.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

326. *Child in company of adult*

If a child, under the age of 10 years, is accompanied by an adult in a rail or road vehicle or on the Corporation's premises, the adult must take all

reasonable steps to prevent the child from acting contrary to these Regulations.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

327. *Place luggage as directed*

A passenger on a rail or road vehicle must place personal or other luggage carried by that passenger as directed by an authorised person.

Penalty: 2 penalty units.

328. *Dangerous goods not to be consigned without prior arrangement*

A person must not consign or deliver to the Corporation for carriage any dangerous goods whether within the meaning of the **Dangerous Goods Act 1985** or otherwise without making a prior arrangement with the Corporation for the carriage of the goods.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

PART 4—UNCLAIMED GOODS AND LOST PROPERTY

401. *Definitions*

In this Part—

“authorised employee” means a tram, train or bus crew member, a member of depot or station staff or an operations officer while on duty;

“goods” means any goods delivered to the Corporation to be carried as freight and which are not claimed and removed by or on behalf of the owner or the person to whom the goods were consigned;

“lost property” means any thing that appears to have been accidentally or deliberately abandoned by the owner or person in charge of it on any rail or road vehicle or the Corporation’s premises.

402. *Found lost property to be handed in*

A person who finds lost property in a rail or road vehicle, or on the Corporation's premises must—

- (a) hand the lost property to an authorised employee or to the employee apparently in charge of the vehicle or relevant part of the premises; or
- (b) deliver or forward the property to Spencer Street Station, Flinders Street Station or one of the Corporation's tram or bus depots.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

403. *Authorised person may request lost property*

A person who finds lost property in a rail or road vehicle or on the Corporation's premises must, if requested by an authorised person or authorised employee, hand the lost property to that person or employee.

Penalty: 5 penalty units.

404. *Sale of unclaimed goods*

- (1) The Corporation may sell or dispose of—
 - (a) any lost property which is not claimed and removed by the owner; and
 - (b) after making a reasonable attempt to contact the owner or the person to whom the goods were consigned, any goods including empties left on the Corporation's premises or stored elsewhere by the Corporation.
- (2) The Corporation may sell or dispose of—
 - (a) any goods or lost property likely to deteriorate, immediately; and
 - (b) any empties after 7 days; and
 - (c) all other goods or lost property after the expiration of 28 days from the date on which the lost property was found or the goods were not claimed.

405. *Expenses and title*

If goods or lost property are sold by the Corporation under regulation 404—

- (a) the Corporation may deduct from the proceeds of the sale the expenses of the sale and any amounts due to the Corporation for freight, storage and other charges; and
 - (b) the title of the purchaser is not impeachable on any ground and the purchaser takes the goods or lost property free from any title, interest, estate or right of any other person.
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SCHEDULE

Charges for Crossing Corporation Track with Oversize Vehicles etc.

1. Charges for the Attendance of Corporation Officers or Agents (regardless of the number of Officers or Agents attending).

(a) Suburban railway track crossing—

(i) on a weekday—

(A) if overhead power lines and aerial signal lines are involved—\$524 plus \$262 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(B) if overhead power lines are involved but aerial signal lines are not—\$460 plus \$230 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(C) if aerial signal lines are involved but overhead power lines are not—\$214 plus \$107 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(D) in all other cases—\$150 plus \$75 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(ii) at the weekend or on a public holiday—

(A) if overhead power lines and aerial signal lines are involved—\$598 plus \$299 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(B) if overhead power lines are involved but aerial signal lines are not—\$526 plus \$263 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(C) if aerial signal lines are involved but overhead power lines are not—\$244 plus \$122 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(D) in all other cases—\$172 plus \$86 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(b) Country railway track crossing—

(i) on a weekday—

(A) if aerial signal lines are involved—\$64 plus \$32 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(B) in all other cases—\$52 plus \$26 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(ii) at the weekend or on a public holiday—

(A) if aerial signal lines are involved—\$72 plus \$36 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(B) in all other cases—\$58 plus \$29 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;

(c) Tramway track crossing—

- (i) on a weekday—
 - (A) if overhead power lines are involved—\$358 plus \$179 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;
 - (B) in all other cases—\$150 plus \$75 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;
 - (ii) at the weekend or on a public holiday—
 - (A) if overhead power lines are involved—\$408 plus \$204 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours;
 - (B) in all other cases—\$172 plus \$86 per hour for each hour after the first 2 hours.
2. Charges for Vehicles used by the Corporation Officers or Agents at Crossing Site—
- (1) Car (Sedan or station wagon)—10.30 cents per kilometre;
 - (2) 4 wheel drive—14.74 cents per kilometre;
 - (3) Van—15.63 cents per kilometre;
 - (4) Utility—15.61 cents per kilometre;
 - (5) Truck—25.41 cents per kilometre.

The Kilometre distance is the sum of—

- (a) the distance from the relevant depot on the previous work site of the vehicle to the crossing site (whichever is the shorter distance); and
- (b) the distance from the crossing site to the relevant depot on the next work site of the vehicle (whichever is the shorter distance).
